Public libraries have lately been in the spotlight for their on-the-ground work during the many recent protests around the nation. Academic libraries, though perhaps less in the spotlight, have also been hard at work helping educate their communities and collecting materials surrounding these critical recent events. We've invited two academic librarians in the social sciences to talk with us about their librarianship and its intersections with social justice, with a particular focus on their work around Ferguson, MO and the Black Lives Matter movement.

Makiba Foster is a subject librarian at Washington University in St. Louis. Her subject areas include American Culture Studies, American History, Sociology, and Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies. In addition to those duties she co-leads the Documenting Ferguson project. Documenting Ferguson is a community sourced digital repository created to capture regional response to the killing of Michael Brown, Jr. and protest surrounding his death.

Niamh Wallace is an Assistant Librarian at the University of Arizona Libraries and liaison to the School of Social & Behavioral Sciences. With her colleague Nicole Pagowsky, she helped to compile content for a library topic guide on last year's protests against police violence in Ferguson, MO. She will speak about the creation and reception of the guide as well as the need for academic library commitment to social justice.
